What can I do on the Student Web Service/ROSI?

- ⇒ Add/drop courses, add/change meeting sections, list own courses and status of request
- ⇒ View/Print fees invoice
- ⇒ **View Grades and Academic Record**
- ⇒ Print T2202A tax forms
- ⇒ Reactivate or update PIN
- ⇒ Update EMAIL address – must be "utoronto.ca", address, phone numbers, contact information, and view other personal information
- ⇒ View own timetable

All students must pay their tuition and fees by the stated deadline. St. Augustine's Seminary and the University of Toronto will send periodic reminders to your utoronto.ca account.

If payment is not made by the financially cancelled deadline, the registration will be deleted from the system. Students must then contact the Registrar for re-entry into the course.

Fees are subject to change and all updates are posted on our website; click on **Academic** then **Student Info** to **Fees and Financial Aid**.

Paper Invoices are no longer sent by mail. If you require a paper invoice, please contact Theresa Vicioso. Please remember that payment is to be made through your bank [via teller, or web-banking, etc]
