TITLE: Johannine Literature

TERM: 20111 (January 2011)

PROFESSOR: Fr. Walter Werbylo

REGISTRATION: LIMITED TO 30

COURSE DESCRIPTION: Introduction to the Johannine writings concerning authorship, unity and historicity. Exploration of basic themes in this tradition, as revealing the conflicts and changes in the community of the Beloved Disciple. Exegesis of selected passages from the Gospel and 1 John. Lectures, discussions, midterm exam, paper, final exam. Prerequisite: An Introduction to New Testament course.

COURSE OUTCOMES OR OBJECTIVES: 1) To understand various passages selected by the instructor from the gospel of John and from the First Letter of John. 2) To understand the structure and the themes which characterize the gospel of John and of the First Letter of John. 3) To know the manner in which the deeds and words of Jesus came to be proclaimed in the gospel of John. 4) To have an in depth knowledge of one passage selected by the student from the gospel of John.
